Walker To Receive 2024 Saunders Service Award

When the 2024 ACA Top Graduate paper award is presented, Jefferson Walker will be able to take part of the credit. While he didn't work with the doctoral student from University of Southern Mississippi who is this year's winner, Walker as a former faculty member at the school in Hattiesburg started encouraging USM students to submit their work to the ACA Convention.

Now his promotion of and personal commitment to growing the Alabama Communication Association for so many years is paying off as more than 20 presenters at this year's convention are from out-of-state.

Walker's hard work and dedication are two of the reasons he's the 2024 recipient of the John H. Saunders Service Award, which will be presented during the Presidential Luncheon at this year's convention at the University of North Alabama.

"It's nice to get an award for something I would do regardless," said Walker, upon learning that he is this year's recipient. "To receive this award is a big deal for me."

An assistant professor at University of Montevallo, Dr. Walker is beginning his final year as executive director of the association, an organization in which he's now held every elected position.

Walker was elected first as secretary while he was a Ph.D. student at The Univer-

sity of Alabama. Then, he continued up the ACA leadership ladder serving while teaching out of state on the faculty not only at Southern Miss, where he taught for one year, but also at Louisiana Tech.

He vividly recalls attending his first ACA Convention at the University of South Alabama in 2011. He's been a part of every ACA convention since then. Whether it's serving as a respondent during a research session or helping set up the chairs for the luncheon, pitching in where needed is just second nature for Walker.

"I love the ACA and I don't even think about it," he said.

In recommending him for the award, one of his colleagues cited his stellar service record during his five years at University of Montevallo where, among other roles, he's served as an undergraduate student advisor since 2022.

"He creates a supportive environment where his students, advisees, and mentees can learn the essential professional skills they need to function on their own after they graduate," the University of Montevallo faculty member said.

Walker's commitment to his students is certainly one of the reasons he was named director of the Honors Program at University of Montevallo. In the upcoming year, he will train his successor, the ACA Executive Director-Elect who will be chosen at the convention in Florence.

2024 ACA TOP PAPER WINNERS

UAH, Southern Miss students, 4-Person Faculty Team Take Top Honors For Research Papers

A four-person research team from four institutions will be recognized with the Top Faculty Paper award at the 14th Annual Alabama Communication Association Convention.

Leading the team is J. Patrick McGrail from Jacksonville State University, who collaborated with Ewa McGrail from Georgia State, Daniel Rieger from Broward College and Alicja Rieger from Valdosta State University.

The winning paper is entitled "Al-Generated Omniprose: An Ethical Framework for Educational Contexts"

"Al is a double-edged sword, said Ewa McGrail. "We need to figure out meaningful and learner-enhancing, rather than learner-replacing ways to use it."

While McGrail is a professor of Language and Literacy Education at Georgia State, Daniel Rieger is professor of Philosophy and Religious Studies at Broward College in Southeast Florida.

"I am grateful to have the opportunity to contribute to an interdisciplinary discussion concerning the ethics of artificial intelligence usage, especially in higher education, said Daniel Rieger.

Two students from the University of Alabama in Huntsville will receive the Bradley-Bryant Top Undergraduate

Student Paper Award.

Alison Gongre wrote a paper entitled "The Mythical Power of Popular Culture on Protest Visuals."

Halle Huber wrote a rhetorical critique on a topic with special meaning to her.
